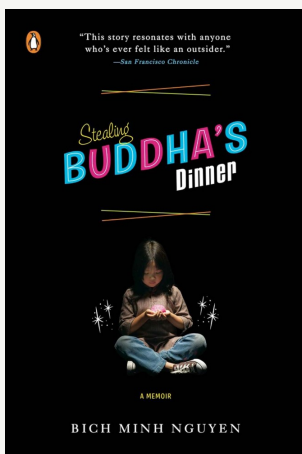

Third Thursday Workshop: Citation Workshop

On November 18 at 12:30 and 5:30, the Vise Library will have a citation workshop. Reference and Instruction Librarian Claire Walker will be on hand to help students format their in-text citations and references lists in APA, MLA, or Turabian style.

Students who rely on

citation generators from websites, databases, or programs can bring their papers in to be double checked, since those resources often format citations incorrectly.

“It is important to cite sources correctly, and non-traditional sources, such as videos, can be tricky to cite,” states Walker.

“Students can drop by the Citation Workshop, and we’ll make sure their citations are correct.”
