New ProQuest Databases!



Over the summer, the Vise Library added many ProQuest databases to its collection. That's great news for those who know what ProQuest is, but what does it mean for everyone else who may not be as database savvy?

ProQuest is the name of the company that hosts a group of databases about different subject areas. The library has access to 11 different ProQuest databases:

1. **ProQuest Biology Journals**— Full text journals in the life sciences
2. **ProQuest Central**— A multidisciplinary database with over 9,475 full-text titles and covering over 160 subject areas.
3. **ProQuest Computing**— Computing journals with full-text research on topics such as database design and web

commerce.

4. **ProQuest Education Journals**— Leading full-text journals in education and related fields
5. **ProQuest Health Resources**— Full-text information covering numerous aspects of health for a wide range of people who need health information.
6. **ProQuest Newspapers**— Online access to national and regional newspapers, including *The Tennessean*.
7. **ProQuest Nursing and Allied Health Source**— Complete, full-text information from leading nursing, allied health, and related publications.
8. **ProQuest Psychology**— Full-text coverage from top psychology and related publications.
9. **ProQuest Religion**— A

comprehensive collection of journals covering religious issues and perspectives.

10. **ProQuest Science Journals**— Full-text and images for the leading journals in science and technology.
11. **ProQuest Social Science Journals**— Full-text journals covering the social sciences.
